#### Pima Air and Space Museum

Our 7th grade students enjoyed a spectacular trip to the Pima Air & Space museum. Students got to connect the knowledge they acquired from books and conversations in the classroom with historical artifacts from the past, present and insight

into the future. Students were able to take tours in person with real-life flying heroes and hear their experiences in combat. This allowed students to put themselves behind the controls of a device that could overcome gravitational forces, and how the technology from the past has been used everyday to take man from state to state in just hours and eventually into



space. Our students were ready to jump into many of the airplanes sitting on the expansive campus from the presidential, business to the military planes. Students took that experience back to the classroom and wanted to find out more about space sciences.

Oh the places you will go! Eighth graders took the opportunity along with their teacher, Mrs. Wilson with parent support to the Flandrau Planetarium on the site of the University of Arizona campus. It was a great opportunity for the 8th grade students to apply what they learned in the classroom regarding the rock cycle to observing a collection of rocks from meteors to other space phenomena. This experience allowed them to touch, identify, and put to use the vocabulary learned in the classroom to practical field experience.
